#### **DEATH OF MR. T.W. MORPHEY**

We deeply regret to record the death of Mr. Thomas William MORPHEY, which occurred after two days illness at Hazelwood on Wednesday afternoon. He had been in failing health for some years, but did not take to his bed until Monday night. Mr. MORPHEY came to Ryde 42 years ago as assistant to the late Mr. JACOBS, secretary of the Y.M.C.A. He subsequently succeeded him in Lind-street, and held the position for 19 years. Later on after Mr. JACOBS'S death, he became secretary of the Y.M.C.A. Hazelwood Seaside Home, and he had held that position for over 23 years. He took a prominent part in conducting the various Bible Classes in connection with the Y.M.C.A., and was deeply interested himself in the welfare of any young man who came under his care. Hundreds of young fellows up and down the country will hear of his death with feelings of profound sorrow. Mr. MORPHEY'S kindly, gentle disposition won him hosts of friends throughout the community. If he had lived until December 13 he would have been 65 years of age. Since Hazelwood has been a Red Cross Hospital Mr. MORPHEY has devoted much of his time to the welfare of the wounded soldiers, and many of the men who have spent their convalescent period at Hazelwood have expressed warm appreciation of all he did for them. The interment will take place at the Borough Cemetery to-day (Saturday). There will be a service at the Evangelical Protestant Chapel, Newport-street, at 2 o'clock. By request there will be no flowers. The greatest sympathy is felt for Mrs MORPHEY and family.
