We have to record the death, on Sunday, at his residence Solent View, Castle-street, of Mr. James FAIRALL, a very old and respected inhabitant. Mr. FAIRALL, who was in his 80<sup>th</sup> year, was born at Newtown, and first came to Ryde in 1812. Proving himself a reliable business man, he obtained the appointment of assistant overseer for the town under the old Commissioners, and on giving up that position was appointed assistant overseer for the whole parish. He resigned in 1854, when the Ryde Improvement Act was passed, and was elected a Commissioner. from that time till a few years ago, Mr. FAIRALL was a prominent member of the governing body, and when the town was made a borough his long service was recognised on his elevation to the aldermanic bench. Mr. FAIRALL was one of the originators of the Ryde Building Society, and a director up to 1870, in which year he was elected secretary of the society, and continued to hold that position till 1879, when the infirmities of advancing age necessarily compelled his retirement. Like many other old inhabitants Mr. FAIRALL succumbed to the severe cold last month, which brought on an attack of bronchitis.

## THE LATE MR. JAS. FAIRALL

Mr. Jas. FAIRALL, for many years one of the leading townspeople, died on Sunday last. He will long be remembered for his zealous services in connection with Ryde and East Medina Building Societies, for which he acted as secretary for a number of years. He also held the appointment of assistant overseer to the parish of Newchurch, prior to the appointment of Mr. James FLUX. The deceased always took an active interest in the welfare of the town, having served as a Commissioner of Ryde under the Improvement Act, and he was one of the first Aldermen when the town obtained the Charter of Incorporation. He was in his 80<sup>th</sup> year.
