OBITUARY MR. H. H. COLUMBINE

Mr. **Hubert Howard COLUMBINE**, F.I.A.C., of Melton Hall, Dover Street, died at Newport on Wednesday of last week at the age of 69.

A retired schoolmaster and fellow of the Society of Company Accountants, Mr. COLUMBINE had held appointments at many famous schools throughout this country. He was born in Leeds, where his Father was schoolmaster, and he and his brother both entered the scholastic profession Mr. COLUMBINE taught at the Blue Coat Boys' School, Sheffield, the Police Orphanage, Twickenham, on the training ships Warspite and Exmouth, and on his retirement in 1936 he had completed 20 years at the School for Crippled Boys, at Kensington. He had lived at Ryde since he retired and became known and respected by many. Recently he was appointed to the Goodwill Committee which was formed in Ryde as an effort to mediate between townsfolk who were unable to pay rates as a result of the war and the rating authorities. He had also joined the Home Guard where his knowledge of accountancy proved of great assistance on the clerical staff. Besides the widow a son and daughter are left.

The funeral service at the house on Saturday was conducted by the Rev. H.B. WORTHINGTON and the Rev. R.G. COVENY, Mr. WORTHINGTON officiating at the interment at Ryde Cemetery. The mourners were Mr. Hubert COLUMBINE (son), Mr. R.B. ROACH, and the Rev. R.G. COVENEY. Captain F.E. BREACHER and Platoon Commander L.G. TANCOCK represented "A" Company Home Guard from whom a wreath was received.
