MILITARY FUNERAL -

The funeral took place on Friday afternoon of Sergt. **Archibald MOORE**, of the East Lancashire Regt. One of the wounded soldiers staying at Hazelwood. The first part of the service was held in All Saints Church, the officiating clergy being the Rev. Hugh Le FLEMING and Lord MOUNT-MORRES. The principal mourners were Mr. and Mrs. R.MOORE (father and mother), Mrs. GARRETT and Miss Agnes MOORE (sisters), Mrs. Arthur MOORE (sister-in-law), Sergt. GARRETT East Lancashire Regt. (brother-in-law). A firing party of the 2nd Wessex headed the procession, followed by the band of the Warwickshire Regt. Some of the deceased's wounded comrades at Hazelwood and Red Cross Nurses, together with a contingent of the 2nd Wessex followed. The coffin was covered with the Union Jack, and there were several beautiful wreaths, amongst them being from Colonel Sir George and Lady POCOCK, Mr. J.W.HATHWAY, Quarrhurst, Binstead, Mr. HUMPHREY and children, Staff Sergts. And Sergts. of the 2nd Wessex, Nursing Staff Red Cross Hospital, Hazelwood. Three volleys were fired over the grave and the "Last Post" sounded by buglers of the 2nd Wessex.
