DEATH OF MR JAMES HARBOUR

Our obituary contains the announcement of the death of Mr **James HARBOUR**, one of our most industrious and enterprising tradesmen and a commissioner of the town of Ryde. His loss will be severely felt by his family and friends, as well as those engaged with him in business transactions. As a commissioner he was fearless and independent, and thoroughly outspoken with reference to all matters which he considered for the good of the town. Consequently, at the board his loss will be felt also. The Ryde Improvement Act provides that vacancies by death are to be filled up within a limited period, and the usual form has been issued, and a successor to the deceased will be appointed on Friday, the 8th prox. Several candidates have, we understand, been already named. It is worthy of note that this is the first vacancy which has occurred by death since the passing of the Ryde Improvement Act, 1854. The remains of the deceased were interred in the Cemetery on Thursday afternoon. Mr CHEVERTON, of Newport, was the undertaker, the funeral being conducted by Messrs R and H PACK.
