DEATH OF MR. G.Y. GROUNDSELL

We regret to record the death, which occurred on Sunday, at Wellington House, Georgestreet, of Mr. George YOUNG GROUNDSELL, who has resided in retirement in the town for some ten years past. The deceased, who was 74 years of age, was born at Wootton Bridge, and served his apprenticeship in the building trade at Ryde. During his former residence here he was a member of the Town Band, which afterwards became merged into the Volunteer Band. After returning to his native village, he settled down at Newport, where he carried on a successful builder's business, during which period he was elected a member of the Newport Corporation and assisted in other capacities in the public work of the ancient borough.

The deceased was a P.M. of the Albany Lodge of Freemasons and P.PRINE and P.G. Org. of the Chapter. Representatives of the Lodge attended the funeral which took place yesterday (Friday) afternoon, the first part being held at the Parish Church. Among the brethren of the Albany Lodge were Brs. G.
