OBITUARY

MR. H.D. WILLIAMS

Many Ryde people and others in many parts of the world will learn with regret of the death on Friday morning, of Mr. **Harry Dudley WILLIAMS**, of 37 Surrey-street, Ryde, who for many years was responsible for the education of hundreds of Ryde boys in his capacity of headmaster of Holy Trinity School and later as headmaster of St. John's Road School, he was respected and loved by everybody who came into contact with him.

Mr. WILLIAMS came to Ryde in 1880 from London to take up An appointment as headmaster of Holy Trinity National School, and after seven years he left there to occupy a similar post at St. John's Road School, which was then a board school, which position he held for 32 years. In August 1919, he retired and then took the secretaryship of the Holy Trinity Club, and continued in that capacity till last year.

A year after he came to the Island he became a member of the Volunteers, which became the I.W. Rifles, and he retired from that company in 1903. he holds the Long Service Decoration, and was also the oldest member of the corps. He was one of the most popular members of the Ryde Branch of the British Legion.

Mr. WILLIAMS was 80 years of age, and had been ailing for nearly two years. He leaves three sons and three daughters. His wife predeceased him twenty years ago.
