We regret to have to record the decease of the Rev. **R. SHERSON**, rector of Yaverland, which took place somewhat suddenly on Saturday night, at the rectory. The deceased who was sixty-eight years of age, was one of the oldest ---if not the senior---of the incumbents of the Island, having been rector of Yaverland between thirty and forty years. The rectory, which is of the value of £230, with a residence, is in the gift of Sir Andrew Snape HAMOND, Bart., of Norton Lodge, Yarmouth.

#### **DEATH OF THE REV. R. SHERSON**

Our obituary of this day records the death of the Rev. **R. SHERSON**, the senior clergyman of the Island. The deceased was 68 years of age, and had been Rector of Yaverland nearly 40 years. The rectory is of the annual value of £230, with residence, and is in the gift of Sir A. S. HAMOND, bart. The remains of the deceased, who was highly respected throughout the Island, were interred in Ryde Cemetery on Thursday morning, the funeral service being impressively performed by the Rev. G. SOUTHOUSE, rural dean, according to promise previously made to deceased. The coffin was of polished oak, and the funeral was conducted by Messrs. R. and H. PACK, of Union-street.
