DEATH OF FORMER MAYORESS OF RYDE.

We much regret we have to announce the death of Mrs. **Kate HAYDEN**, wife of Ald. Edwin HAYDEN, of Landholme, Park-road, a former mayoress of Ryde, which took place on Sunday. Mrs. HAYDEN, who was 72, had been in failing health for some years. It was a matter of keen regret that during her husband's Mayoralty, in 1903-4 she was unable to undertake the duties of Mayoress, which were capably carried out by her daughter-in-law (Mrs. W.E. HAYDEN). A daughter of the late Mr. H.J. JOLLIFFE, of Newchurch, Mrs. HAYDEN always took a very active interest in local public affairs. In 1895 she was elected on the Ladies' Committee of the Board of Guardians, and in the following year was returned as a Guardian for the West Ward, her husband being a successful candidate in another ward. She served for some years on that body, ill health caused her retirement, but she never ceased to take an interest in work amongst the poor. She had a very great fondness for children and, besides the care of her own family, she adopted six orphans, five boys and a girl. Her wonderful influence and the nature of their upbringing is unmistakably reflected in their successful careers. One is an assistant master of a school at Harrow, another a master carpenter at Worthing, a third is in the building trade in Australia, a fourth is a successful Island business man, and the fifth, who has since died, was a manager for Messrs. PICKFORDS, and the girl has become the matron of a home at Lewes. Mrs. HAYDEN was a woman of a quiet and unassuming disposition with strong Christian principles. Of late years she had kept to her home

a great deal and her long illness was borne uncomplainingly. In December, 1935, Ald. And Mrs. HAYDEN celebrated their golden wedding. With her husband and three sons deep sympathy will be felt.

The funeral took place on Thursday, the first part of the service being held at the Baptist Church. The Rev. W. R. LLOYD (Congregational) officiated and said Mrs. HAYDEN was the embodiment of practical Christianity. She had put a number on the road of life with God's and her own blessing behind them. The hymns sung were "Lead, kindly light," and "Abide with me." As the cortege left the church the organist (Miss A. WARNE) played "O rest in the Lord." The family mourners were Ald. E. HAYDEN (husband), Messrs. W. and A. HAYDEN (sons), Mrs. W. HAYDEN and Mrs. A. HAYDEN (daughters-in law), Messrs. Harold and Vernon HAYDEN (grandsons), Mr. and Mrs. H. BARTON (brother-in-law and sister), Messrs. Frank HAYDEN, Newchurch, and A. H. HAYDEN, Binstead (brothers-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. E. WILTSHIRE (brother-in-law and sister), and Mrs. MAITLAND (sister).
