DEATH OF MR. CHARLES DYCER

We have to record the death on Monday, at the advanced age of 89, of Mr. **Charles DYCER**, of Luther Lodge, Strand. Mr. DYCER had lived some years in the town, and was of a very charitable disposition. A few months since he subscribed no less than £100 towards the fund of the Royal Isle of Wight Infirmary, and other institutions and charities have benefitted recently to a similar extent, by his generosity.

During the Peninsular War, Mr. DYCER was attached to the staff in some civil capacity, and shared the retreat of the British Army, and was present at the battle of Corunna, when Sir John MOORE was killed. He was also present at the burial of that gallant Commander. Shortly after Mr. DYCER severed his connection with the Army, and became a veterinary surgeon, in which profession he was successful.
