The death occurred last week at her home of Mrs. **Alexandrina Mimie Young PALMER**, of "The Long Cottage," Dover-street. Born at Cwmavon, South Wales, where her father was a well-known doctor she moved with her father to Clifton, Bristol, where she resided until her marriage in December 1913. Mr. and Mrs. PALMER came to Ryde after the death of her brother, who had been in practice with Messrs. ROACH, PITTIS & Co. of Newport, and Mr. PALMER became the senior partner of that firm.
