A RYDE NONAGENARIAN –

The funeral took place at Ryde Cemetery on Friday of Mr. **Colin Norman HAMILTON**, OF Alberta Villa, St. John's Wood-road, Ryde, a former cabinet maker, whose death occurred on Tuesday week. Had he lived, he would have been 98 in April.

Mr. HAMILTON, who was a Londoner, had lodged with Mr. and Mrs. C.P.AVERILL for the past eight years, and had lived 27 years in the Island. When he retired as a cabinet maker he bought a small confectioner's shop in Bristol, but had to give it up owing to failing health. He had been a widower since 1933 and leaves two sons and a daughter, another son having died four years ago.

The Rev. A.J.PEARMAN (Vicar of St. John's Church), officiated at the service. Mourners were Mr. and Mrs. C.HAMILTON (son and daughter-in-law), Miss F.HAMILTON (sister), W.R.ROLFE (grandson) and Mrs. ROLFE, Mrs. J.STEVENS (grand-daughter), Mr. C.AVERILL and Mr. J.WILCOX. Mr. HAMILTON's only daughter lives in California and was unable to attend. Interment took place in his wife's grave.
