DEATH OF MR. P. A. MORRIS

A much respected and widely known townsman, Mr. **Percy Arthur MORRIS**, died at 39 Arthur-street on Friday week, aged 71. A native of Brading, he was for over 50 years in the employ of Messrs. A. HOLMES and Sons in High-street, and when he retired about four years ago was manager of the tailoring department. He was one of the oldest fanciers in the Island and a member of every local society. His birds won many prizes in South Coast exhibitions. He had held high provincial rank in the R.O.A.B. He was twice married, his first wife being Miss Mary GUY, a member of an old local family. His second wife was formerly Mrs. WOOD, of Sandown, by whom he is survived. He leaves three daughters, his only son having died three years ago. Canon MOXON conducted the funeral service in the Parish Church on Tuesday, and deceased's favourite hymn "Jesu, Lover of my soul," was sung. The mourners were Mr. C. WOOD (stepson), Messrs. R. NUNN, L.G. COOPER, and F. WHITE (sons-in-law), Mr. L. MORRIS, Cowes (brother), Mr. A. GALE (brother-in-law), Mr. W. JACKSON (nephew), Mr. S. MERWOOD, Mr. A. DYER, Mr. A.J. HOLMES (Messrs. HOLMES and Sons), Mr. S. COFFIN (representing former fellow employees), and Mrs. V. COLLEYPRIEST. The flowers included a token from the management and staff of Messrs. HOLMES and Sons.
