DEATH OF CAPT. POWELL

We regret to record the death of Capt. **William POWELL**, late of the Bengal Commissariat, which occurred at his residence, Subathoo, Argyll-street, on Friday last. The deceased who was 85 years of age and had seen a great deal of foreign service previous to his retirement, has made Ryde his home for a good many years. He suffered from bronchitis and the cold accelerated his death, which came somewhat suddenly as he had been about during the early portion of the week.

The funeral took place at the Cemetery on Wednesday afternoon. The first portion of the service was held at All Saints' Church (in the work of which he took considerable interest for many years), and was carried out by the Vicar (the Rev Hugh le FLEMING) who also officiated at the graveside.

Alderman THIRKELL attended as mourner, Mr. GODDARD of West Hampstead (nephew and executor) being unable to attend in consequence of the serious illness of his wife. The remains were interred by the side of his wife, who died a few months ago, and who was with her husband throughout the Indian Mutiny. There were several wreaths.

The funeral arrangements were conducted by Messrs. PURNELL and PURNELL.
