DEATH OF COMMANDER MCQUEEN

We have to record the death of Commander **McQUEEN**, R.N., of Marina Terrace, Ryde, which event took place off Wicklow, Ireland, on the 12th inst., rather suddenly, from heart disease.

His remains were interred in the Ryde Cemetery, on Tuesday afternoon, being carried to their last resting place by a number of Coastguardsmen, several Naval officers in uniform, acting as pall-bearers. Mr. Alfred WOODWARD, M.R.C.S., was also present. The coffin which was of oak, was covered with the Union Jack, in lieu of a pall, the top being hidden from view by a large number of flowers. The service was most impressively read by the Rev. A.H. DELAFIELD, who is at present acting as curate at Holy Trinity Church, during the temporary absence of the Vicar. The funeral was conducted by Mr. Charles YEATES. The deceased was 51 years of age.
