MEMORIAL WINDOW

– **Miss MILLIGAN** has just had erected in the Holy Trinity Church, a splendid coloured window, in memory of her late father and mother – the work having been most satisfactorily performed by Messrs. HEATON, BUTLER, and BAYNES, of London. In the upper division of the window there is a representation of the baptism of our Lord, the dove descending on him from above, - with the inscription under it, “This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.” In the second division is a representation of the Good Shepherd, holding a crook in the left hand and a lamb to his bosom with his right. In a lower division are two angels, with expanded wings, holding a scroll with the words “Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?” In the sill of the window is inserted a brass plate, with the following inscription:

“To the glory of God, and in memory of Robert MILLIGAN, late Captain in the 2nd Life Guards, severely wounded at Waterloo when Lieut. in the 11th Light Dragoons, who died, aged 88, Dec. 21st, 1875, and of Elizabeth Margaret, his wife, daughter of Matthew BAILLIE, M.D., who died, aged 82, June 25th, 1876.”
