THE LATE MRS. HOWE

The funeral of Mrs. **Phoebe HOWE**, the late valued and trusted nurse of the Lady SUTTON took place in Ryde Cemetery on Tuesday in last week. Deceased had for many years acted as nurse

and housekeeper to the family, and her death occurred very suddenly on 23rd June at Mr. Cecil SUTTON's residence, Blunsdon, near Swindon. By deceased's express wish her body was conveyed to Ryde for interment with that of her only son, who was accidentally killed on the Isle of Wight Railway some few years ago.

The body was enclosed in a shell with outer coffin of polished oak with massive brass fittings and engraved brass plate inscribed

PHOEBE HOWE
Died June 23, 1910
Aged 69 years.

The first part of the service was taken in All Saints' Church, the Vicar of Ryde officiating, the principal mourners being Mr. J. HOWARD (brother), Mr. S. KNIGHT (brother-in-law), Mrs Du BOULAY, Colonel and Mrs. RHODES, Mr. Cecil and Miss SUTTON, Mrs. BOWNER, Nurse TILLEY and others.
