MR. CHARLES WILCOX

The remains of Mr. **Charles WILCOX**, late ticket collector at Ryde Pier for the South-Western and South Coast Railway, who died on the 22nd inst., after a few weeks illness, were interred in the Cemetery on Thursday afternoon. Deceased who was carried and followed to his last resting place by a large number of the Pier and Railway employees in uniform, each wearing the badge of the Hampshire Friendly Society.

Among the many beautiful wreaths was one from the Orange Club, mounted on a wooden monogram of the Order, of which deceased was a member. Deceased was 24 years of age and was held in high esteem by a large number of friends.

The service was conducted by the Rev. T. HUME.
