DEATH OF MR. F. N. BRODERICK

We regret to record the death, on Saturday morning last, of Mr. **Frederick Nutt BRODERICK**, an old and respected townsman. Mr. BRODERICK had been ill for many months with paralysis, which, gradually creeping upwards, at last touched the vital organs. For many years Mr. BRODERICK carried on business in St. Thomas'-square as an engraver, stationer, lithographer, and photographer, and formerly published a little sitirical journal, *The Earwig*, which once a month gave an amusing cartoon relating to local events. In the best of these, the late Mr. LEACH (a former mayor) is depicted as a large spider hanging over the entrance of the Conservative Club, the accompanying motto being "will you walk into my parlour." Mr. BRODERICK, we need hardly add, was a liberal, but he was a man of broad sympathies and most kindly and thoroughly conscientious disposition. He was for some little time a member of the Ryde Town Council. The funeral took place on Thursday afternoon, and by a singular coincidence the bells of the Parish Church struck out the merry chimes for Miss POOLE's wedding, just as the coffin was lowered to its last resting place. The Rev. R. NUTT officiated at the grave. A number of beautiful wreaths showed the affectionate regard with which this good, but quiet and retiring man, had inspired many friends.
