**DEATH OF MR. WILLIAM BEAZLEY**

We have this week to record the death of a very old inhabitant of this town, who was universally known and respected---we refer to Mr. **William BEAZLEY**, who for many years carried on the business of a bread and biscuit baker in the High-street of this town.

A few years ago Mr. BEAZLEY retired from business, in which he was succeeded by his son of the same name, who has since died. The subject of our notice, when he gave up business, and went to live with a married daughter at Brighton, where he expired on Thursday last after a short illness.

His remains were brought to Ryde, and were interred in the Cemetery here on Monday afternoon. In accordance with the expressed wish of the deceased, he was buried by the side of his wife, the Rev. Paul ROBERTS officiating. Mr. BEAZLEY had attained the ripe age of 88.
