DEATH OF MRS. HAMILTON

It is with profound regret that we record the death of Mrs. **Gertrude Catherine Mary Angela HAMILTON**, wife of Lieut. Col. J.F.C. HAMILTON, J.P., C.A., which occurred at Spencer Lodge on Monday in her 49th year. The funeral took place on Wednesday, the first part of the service being conducted at St. Mary's (R.C.) Church. The Rev. R.H.T. STENART, S.J., C.F. (brother of the deceased) was celebrant assisted by the Very Rev. Canon MONGAN, deacon, and the Rev. Dom. R.B. STENART, O.S.B. (brother of the deceased), sub-deacon. The mourners were Lieut. Col. J.F.C. HAMILTON, Capt. and Mrs. STENART (brother and sister-in-law), Miss FORTESCUE (cousin), and the Revs. Dom. P. BLANCHON. O.S.B., J. BANDOT, O.S.B., and DE LANNURIEN, O.S.B., from Quarr Abbey. Amongst those present at the church were Capt. and Mrs. R.M. ALEXANDER, Mrs. MEARES, Mr. G. FARDELL, Miss CLIFFORD. Mr. E.F. STANFIELD, and Miss PRESTON. The coffin was of wax polished oak with brass ring handles,

and a large brass crucifix and engraved brass plate on the lid bore the inscription :

“Gertrude HAMILTON.
Died October 27th, 1919.
Aged 49 years.
R.I.P.”
