DEATH OF CAPT, ALEXANDER J.P.

We regret to announce the death which occurred somewhat suddenly on Wednesday evening at his residence "Strathallan," Queen's-road, of Capt. Ranald Mitchell ALEXANDER, a Justice of the Peace for the borough and one of the best known residents of Ryde. The deceased gentleman who was 73 years of age was taken ill at the Royal Victoria Yacht Club of which he was one of the oldest and most respected members on Tuesday and was brought home in a semi conscious state his death being due to a paralytic seizure of which he had had two previous attacks. He leaves a widow and two daughters (having lost his son in the war) with whom much sympathy is expressed. The late Capt. ALEXANDER was a thorough all round sportsman and excellent shot and was largely instrumental in the formation of the local Gun Club of which he was secretary for several years until it lapsed. He also took keen interest in yachting and was a clever cartoonist of which specimens are still to be seen in the Conservative Club and more than one found its way into "Punch" and the "I.W. Observer." The deceased was a native of the Bridge of Allan, Scotland, but had resided here for many years and was a most genial personality and well liked by a numerous circle of friends. The funeral takes place to-day (Saturday) at All Saints at 2 pm.
