FUNERAL SERVICES AT ST. MARY'S.

On Saturday last the funeral of the late Mrs. Catherine Elizabeth CUDDON, wife of F. T. CUDDON, Esq., of Gray's Inn, London, took place at Ryde Cemetery. The deceased lady was staying at Wenman house, and died after her accouchement. As Mr. CUDDON is greatly respected at the Dominican Priory at Haverstock-hill, where he resides, several of the monks came down to Ryde to take part in the obsequies of the deceased lady, which attracted more than usual attention. The hearse and four mourning carriages arrived at St. Mary's Church about 10 o'clock, and the coffin, which was conveyed inside the church, was met by the Rev. J. B. CAHILL, priest of St. Mary's, who recited the "De Profundis," followed by chanting of the "Misere," and the recital of the prayers usual on these occasions. The coffin having been placed at the entrance of the Sanctuary, a solemn plain Gregorian Mass was performed, the officiating priests being – Celebrant, The Very Rev. Antonius WILLIAMS, O.P., Prior of St Dominic's Priory, Haverstock-hill; Deacon, The Very Rev. Edmund BUCKLER, O.P., Dominican Priory, Woodchester, Gloucestershire; Sub-Deacon, Rev. Sadoe SILVESTER, Haverstock-hill; there were present in the Sanctuary The Very Rev. Father GALLWEY, S.J., Rector of Farmer-street, London, and the Rev. Dominic TRENOW, O.P., from the Convent, Carisbrooke. At the end of the Mass the Libera was sung and the Absolution pronounced, after which the Rev. Father GALLWEY, S.J., gave a short address to the members of the family. The Dead March in "Saul" was played on the organ, and the cortege proceeded to the cemetery, the Rev. J. B. CAHILL conducting the service at the grave, the choral portion being omitted. Beautiful wreaths and crosses of flowers were placed on the coffin by members of the family. Mr. SALTER, organist of St. Mary's, presided at the organ, and the funeral

arrangements were carried out by Messrs. RIDDETT, and Son, of Union-street.
