DEATH OF SIR JOHN M'GREGOR, KCB.

The death is announced of Sir John M'Gregor, MD., KCB., on Saturday last, at Ryde. The deceased (who assumed the name of M'Gregor in 1863) was the second son of Mr Duncan M'Andrew, and was born at Perth in 1792. Having studied for some time at the University of Edinburgh, in 1809 he entered the medical department of the army, and saw considerable service. In 1856 he received the appointment of Inspector-General of Hospitals; and three years later, in 1859, was appointed one of the honorary physicians of Her Majesty, in the same year being created a Knight Commander of the Order of the Bath.
