DEATH OF MR. H. HARRIS

Mr. **Herbert HARRIS** passed away at Merrywood, St. Thomas-street, on Tuesday, in his 80th year. He was a son of the late Mr. J.H. HARRIS of George-street, and was articled as a draughtsman at the I.W. Railway engineering works in 1877. In 1882 he was awarded the bronze medal at Hartley Institution, Southampton, for his design of a pumping engine, and in the same year he passed 11 branches of science and gained nine first-class successes. For a time he was employed by Sir Hiram MAXIM in London.

On returning to Ryde with his wife he took over a fancy and needlework business in Union-street and retired in 1910. He made many clever designs for garments, among them those accepted by Queen Ena of Spain for her wedding trousseau. He was an original member of the Vectis Boating and Fishing Club and a former member of the rowing club. He was a familiar figure at the regattas of local yacht clubs. In 1895 he married Miss Louisa DADSWELL, and sincere sympathy is extended to her at the termination of 45 years of happy companionship.

The funeral was conducted by the Rev. H.B. WORTHINGTON at the Cemetery yesterday (Friday). The mourners were Mrs. HARRIS (widow), Mr. F. HARRIS (brother), Miss E.L. HARRIS (sister), and Nurse SMYTHERS. Lovely flowers were received.
