SUDDEN DEATH

Mr. **Bernard Charles PINE**, aged 57, a single man, who resided with his sister at 11 Monkton-street, died suddenly on Wednesday. Since the war he had been employed by the Gaslight Co. as watchman and telephone operator. Soon after being relieved from work at 1.a.m. he was found lying collapsed by his bicycle in Monkton-street. Dr. FIRMAN-EDWARDS was summoned, but deceased had passed away before his arrival. It is presumed that the change in temperature from the warm room which he had been sitting affected his heart. After a post-mortem the Deputy Coroner decided that an inquest was unnecessary.

ARNOLD; life long pal and friend, Bob; Aggie and Tom; the employees of the Ryde Gaslight Co.; the WARD family; and Will and Peggie, Cis, and Bert, Stella, and Ted. Mr. C. LANGDON was the undertaker.

NB: We have found many discrepancies, in as much as Bernard and Charles appear to be one and the same person. Re the Charles J. PINE shown on the census 1891, we have searched and cannot find any other record for this person, and until we can do so, we will treat the entry as a possible mistake by the Enumerator.
