DEATH OF MR. J. W. JACKSON

After an illness extending over several weeks the death of Mr. **James William JACKSON**, of Glencoe, Yelfs-road, took place on Saturday. Seventy-six years of age, the deceased was a life long resident, and well-known. In his younger days he served in the architects office, and later carried on business in the Arcade, from which he retired several years ago. For over 40 years he served either as a churchwarden or sidesman at Holy Trinity Church, but his association with the church extended over a much longer period. An ardent supporter of the Conservative cause, Mr. JACKSON was one of the oldest members of the Lind-street Club, by the members of which, as by all who knew him, he was greatly respected and liked. For several years he served on the committee.

The funeral took place on Tuesday, the service being held at Holy Trinity Church, and conducted by the Vicar (the Rev. the Hon. Ivo FEINNES).
