DEATH OF A NONAGENARIAN

A well-known and respected resident, Mr. **Frank WOODFORD** died at his home at 44 Arthur-street on Sunday at the age of 93. For the last four years he had been bed-ridden, but he was extremely patient and cheerful. Mr. WOODFORD was a cabinet-maker, and during all his life had been associated with the former High-street Methodist Church, being its oldest trustee. He was also a lifelong and staunch Liberal, a vice-president of the Island Liberal Association, and a member of the local committee of the Hants Friendly Society. Much sympathy is felt with his widow, age 94, at the closing of a long and happy partnership.

The funeral took place on Wednesday, the service being held at the Garfield-road Methodist Church. The Rev. H.B. HOWARD officiated, and Mr. H. BRADING accompanied the singing of two of the deceased's favourite hymns, "For all the Saints" and "Ten thousand times ten thousand."

The mourners were Miss WOODFORD and Mrs. NEWNHAM (daughters), Mr. A. NEWNHAM (son-in-law), Miss ADAMS and Mrs. RYALL (nieces), Mr. Frank RYALL (great-nephew), Mr. TOPP, of Salisbury, Mr. GALLOP, and Mrs. H. BRADING. Others present were Messrs. R. SWEETMAN, H. WOODFORD and S. ADAMS (former members of the High-street Church), E.P. TOPP, H. COLLYER, and J.A. FARMER, Mrs. BRADING, and the Misses WARNE, GRAY and BARTLETT.

The interment was at the Cemetery and there were numerous floral tributes, which included one from the friends of the High-street Church. Mr. W. WHEELER was the undertaker.
