MISS. A. M. SPANNER

A much respected and loved person, Miss **Amy Maude SPANNER**, of 25 Victoria-street, died on Thursday, aged 84. She had been in indifferent health for three months.

A native of the town, Miss SPANNER was well known in Ryde, where she had many friends. She was for many years a music teacher, being a talented pianist and singer. She was also the principal at a private school in Trinity-street for 20 years. When only 26 years of age, Miss SPANNER was involved in an accident, seriously damaging her hands, which was a great handicap throughout her life, and two years ago, she was deprived of her sight. For the last 11 years, Miss SPANNER had been cared for by two devoted and loving friends, Mr. and Mrs. William GRANGER.

She was the daughter of the late Mr. Henry SPANNER, who many years ago was a well-known grocer of Ryde and Seaview.

The funeral took place at All Saints' Parish Church on Saturday, the service being conducted Canon A. CORY, R.D. (vicar) and the Rev. J. OUTRAM (assistant priest).

The mourners were Mr. and Mrs. C. PRATT (nephew and niece), and Mr. and Mrs. W. GRANGER (friends).

Miss SPANNER was interred in the family grave at Ryde Cemetery.
