## FUNERAL OF PUPIL TEACHER

On Saturday afternoon the mortal remains of Miss Caroline Adelaide DELEANY, a pupil teacher in the St. John's-road girls school were interred at the cemetery, the Rev. G. CROKE ROBINSON, M.A., a member of the School Board, officiating. The children and the teachers of the school, under Miss GOLDING (the head-mistress), attended at the cemetery and sang the hymn "Safe in the arms of Jesus." Beautiful floral wreaths had been sent by the children and teachers.

Deceased who had just completed the first year of her apprenticeship, was only 16 years of age on the 17<sup>th</sup> of last month. Her death took place on the previous Tuesday, after an illness of three weeks duration. She was much beloved by both teachers and scholars. The vice-chairman of the School Board (Mr. J. CUTLER) and the clerk (Mr. J. FLUX) were also present at the interment.
