The Funeral of the late Mr. **PANNEL**, who had unostentatiously done so much good in the town for many years, took place at the Cemetery on Friday. The Revs. Canon SHEARME and R. R. COUSENS officiating. The body was enclosed in the unpolished oak coffin, with very heavy brass furniture. On the lid was the inscription:

"Charles Lavington PANNEL, Born 23rd January 1818, Died 10th April, 1905."

The mourners were Lady BURTON, the Rev. R.H.E. WELBY, and Messrs. C. HUGOLIN, FREELAND, MONTAGUE TURNER, and E. HUGOLIN, and the deceased's servants.

DEATH OF MR. C. L. PANNEL

Ryde loses by the death of Mr. C. L. PANNEL one of its most respected and generous townsmen. The deceased gentleman (who was 87 years of age), had been ailing for some little time and was gradually growing weaker; heart failure accelerated by influenza, was the cause of his

death, which occurred shortly before eleven on Monday morning last. He had resided in Ryde for many years and was till recently a regular attendant of St. James's Church. The deceased was everywhere noted for his abundant generosity, and was a subscriber to almost every charitable and religious institution in the district. Rarely, if ever, was an appeal for assistance to him made in vain, and his unostentatious methods of helping deserving families and societies win him the love and respect of everyone with whom he came in contact.
