MRS. F. STUART –

The death took place on Thursday of Mrs. **Florence STUART**, at her residence, 3 Warwick-street. Deceased who was 52 years of age, died as a result of a short illness of a month's duration. She was a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. William DORE, and was the widow of the late Mr. Edward James STUART, of London, who predeceased her in 1918. He was a manager of a large American bank, and was buried in Monrovia, California. Mrs STUART spent some years in America, and on first going out there in 1916 was the only British woman on board the liner, which was chased by U-boats.

The funeral took place on Saturday. The Rev. S. A. MARSH officiated, the service being held in Holy Trinity Church, and the interment following at Ryde Cemetery. The family mourners were: Mr. William DORE and Mr. Sidney DORE (brothers), Mrs. BROWN, Mrs. Rose DORE, Miss Minnie DORE and Miss Helen DORE (sisters), Mr. Teddy PARFIT and Mr. BROWN, of Brockenhurst (brothers-in-law).
