THE FUNERAL –

..... took place on Wednesday of Mr. **James BREWER**, for many years in the employ of Mr. William GREEN, wine and spirit merchant, of Union-street. Mr. BREWER was well known and respected in the town, his unostentatious manner and integrity of character causing him to be among the best liked of those in business in the vicinity. He died of cerebral hæmorrhage, after a short illness. The first part of the service was conducted by the Rev. David A. DAVIES at the Congregational Church, of which the deceased was a staunch supporter, being also one of the promoters of the P.S.A. movement. The mourners were Messrs. H. CAVILL, and Arthur WATSON, (nephews), Frank GUY, (brother-in-law), W. JENNINGS, Frederick WOODFORD, PHILLIPS, and William BUTCHER. Among the beautiful floral tokens were tributes from Mr. and Mrs. GREEN, Mr. and Mrs. H. BATTERSBY, the Ryde Liberal Club and the P.S.A.
