SUDDEN DEATH OF MR. REGINALD BOGER

We very much regret to record the death of Mr. **Reginald BOGER**, son of the late Captain BOGER R. N., of Elvington, Ryde. The deceased gentleman was the honorary handicapper of the I. W. Gun Club, and attended the weekly meeting of the Club on Monday. He complained that he did not feel well, and was advised to go home, but he said he felt better in the open air. Nothing serious was, however, anticipated, and it came as a great shock to the members of the Club when they learned that Mr. BOGER died suddenly at half-past ten on Wednesday night, heart failure being the cause of death. Mr. BOGER will be greatly missed by the members of the Gun Club, amongst whom he was extremely popular. He thoroughly understood the handicapping, and took the greatest interest in it.

There will be no shooting at Ashley to-day, Saturday, out of respect to the deceased gentleman, who was also honorary librarian of the Royal Victoria Yacht Club, of which he was a popular and much-liked member. He was only 29 years of age.
