THE LATE MAJOR WIGGINS

The funeral took place on Tuesday of Major **Edward Robert WIGGINS** who was formerly in the Bengal Light Infantry. The deceased who had reached the ripe age of 89 years had been an invalid for some time past. The first part of the service was held at Holy Trinity Church, Rev J. E. EDDIS, the Vicar, officiating, while the Rev W. SHONE concluded the solemn rights at the Cemetery. Col WIGGINS and Col LEWIS were the chief mourners.

DEATH OF MAJOR WIGGINS

The death occurred on Saturday at his residence, Essex House, Wood-street, of Major **Edward Robert WIGGINS**, formerly of the Bengal Light Infantry. The deceased officer who was 89 years of age, had been in feeble health for some time. The funeral took place on Tuesday when the Rev. J. E. EDDIS (vicar) conducted the first part of the service at Holy Trinity Church. At the graveside the Rev. Dr. SHONE officiated. The mourners were Colonel WIGGINS and Colonel LEWIS (nephews).
