TOPP who presided at the organ feelingly played the

Dead March in Saul. The Rev. S. Stanley COULSON who preached from the text "Thou shalt be missed because thy seat be empty" spoke of the useful life which had been lived in their midst. He reminded his hearers that Heaven's empty places are filled only as these seats in the home and Church become vacant. The more we lose to Heaven the greater will our gain be there.
