The remains of another old inhabitant of Ryde, Mrs. **BURROWS**, were interred in Ryde Cemetery, on Tuesday. She was the widow of the late George BURROWS, horse-breaker, who was well known throughout the Island. A short time since Mrs BURROWS paid a visit to London to see a sick son. She caught a cold, which brought on bronchitis, to which she eventually succumbed, and her son, too, has died since. Mrs. BURROWS was the daughter of the late Mr. George SHERWOOD, who for many years in Ryde's palmy days, kept the old Nag's Head Inn, in High Street. Mrs. BURROWS was in her 79<sup>th</sup> year. The funeral service was performed by the assistant priest of St. Mary's Church.
