THE LATE MISS BRIGSTOCKE

By the death of Miss **Mary Harriette Player BRIGSTOCKE**, of Stone Pitts, Ryde, who died on November 21st at the age of 80, several local philanthropic institutions, to which in life she was a generous donor, benefit materially. It was Miss BRIGSTOCKE who provided the town with its splendid recreation ground, and many athletic clubs have been helped materially by her in times of financial stress. She left estate of £33,381 gross and £20,008 net. She bequeathed £100 to the Isle of Wight Infirmary, and to each indoor servant who has been in her employ for seven years one year's wages, and to each outdoor servant who has been in her employ a like period six months wages. To her nephew Orlando Fellowes she bequeathed an annuity of £30, and to her sister Lydia Player MORGAN she left an annuity of £200 and Bignury Farm for life, with remainder to her son Thomas MORGAN in tail mail. She left the church or chapel known as St. Thomas's, Ryde to her nephew William Player BRIGSTOCKE in tail mail. Subject to numerous other legacies, Miss BRIGSTOCKE left the residue of her estate to her nephew George BRIGSTOCKE.
