DEATH OF GENERAL HARRIS

We deeply regret to record the death of General **Philip HARRIS**, of Anglesey Lodge, Buckingham-road, after a long and painful illness, on Sunday, the 15th inst. The deceased gentleman came to Ryde a few years ago to reside, and soon made many friends. He took a deep interest in political matters, and was a prominent member of the Conservative Association. A speech from the general at a political meeting was always racy and to the point, and he was exceedingly popular. He had seen a great deal of service in different parts of the globe, which doubtless, originated the painful disease from which he died.

The funeral took place on Wednesday morning, at the Cemetery. The coffin, which was of polished oak, and brass mountings, was conveyed to the Cemetery on a handsome catafalque, and was covered with a number of wreaths of white flowers.

The mourners were Messrs. HARRIS (the two nephews of the deceased), Mr. J. WORSLEY, Mr. ROBERTS, Dr. TURNER, Dr. BUCK, Colonel MALONE, Lieut SCHOLEFIELD, Lieut H. SWEETMAN. The two latter gentlemen represented the Conservative Association, of which the deceased was a valuable and active member. The service at the grave was performed by the Rev. A. J. WADE, Vicar of Holy Trinity.

Mr. SIMMONDS was the undertaker.

MAJOR-GENERAL PHILIP HARRIS

Late Colonel of the Royal Marines, who died a few days since at Anglesey House, entered the Army in 1846, obtained a lieutenancy in 1848, and a captaincy in 1857. He served in the Caffre war of 1851-53 under Lieutenant-General Sir Harry SMITH, and commanded the Royal Marines disembarked from the Cape Squadron in several actions, for which service he was specially mentioned in despatches, and received a medal. He became major in 1872, was promoted to lieutenant colonel in 1875, colonel in 1880, and became a major-general on retired list in the following year.
