The funeral of Miss **Mary PIGOU**, of Ruscombe, Pellhurst Road, whose death we recorded in our last issue, took place on Saturday last. The first part of the service was held at All Saints Church, the Vicar (the Rev. Hugh Le FLEMING, MA.), officiating there and at the graveside. The remains were enclosed in a polished elm coffin, which bore the inscription:
