THE LATE SIR HENRY DALY'S WILL

Estate duty has been paid on £43,240.0s.6d., as the value of the personal estate of General Sir **Henry Dermot DALY**, of Ryde House, Ryde (I.W.), G.C.B., C.I.E., who was at the siege of Delhi, in command of the Corps of Guides in 1857, in command of Hodson's Horse at the siege of Lucknow in 1858, and of the brigade of Hodson's Horse throughout Sir Hope GRANT's campaign in Oude in 1858-59. Sir Henry died on July 31st last, aged 71 years, and probate of his will has been granted to Colonel Cunliffe MARTIN, Delmar, Cheltenham, C.B., and Mr. George WADHAM, of 19, Essex Street, Strand, Solicitor, power being reserved to grant probate also to the testator's son, Hugh DALY. The will bears date, March 19th, I891, with a codicil of July 25th last. The testator bequeaths to his son, Victor Alexander, 300 shares in the Neadggie Coffee Plantations, and 200 shares in the Coorge Coffee Plantations. He bequeaths to his wife, Dame Charlotte DALY, such furniture and household effects as she may choose, all his shares in the Muree Brewery Company, and the remainder of his shares in the Coorge Coffee Plantation. He bequeaths to his daughters, Mary DALY, Elizabeth DALY, and Alice DALY, £1,000 each; and he devises Niton Farm, Coleman's Farm, Youngwood's Farm, and the Buntz Hill property in the Isle of Wight in trust for all the children of the first marriage, excepting his sons, Edward and Henry. He devises all his other real estate in trust for sale, but he expresses the wish, not to be taken as an obligation, that the real estate may remain in his family as long as possible. Sir Henry DALY leaves the residue of his property in trust for the children of the first marriage, excepting his sons, Edward and Henry.
