DEATH AND FUNERAL OF MRS. HASSARD

An old inhabitant of Ryde passed away on the 4th inst., a lady who has resided at Thanet House for many years. The respect in which the deceased was held was proved at the funeral, a large number of floral tokens being sent by friends. The coffin, which was of polished oak with massive brass furniture, bore the following inscription—"Charlotte Augusta HASSARD, died June 4th, 1904, aged 85 years." The first portion of the service was conducted at Holy Trinity Church, where a large congregation assembled, the Rev. W. G. WHITTAM officiating.

Amongst the mourners were Mr. W. HASSARD, Mr. STEPHENS, Mr. TONGE, Dr. HASSARD, Dr. COLLIS, Colonel LAYARD, Captain GREEN, Rev. ANSTEY, the nurse and staff at Thanet House, and many others.

The outer coffin of polished oak, with massive brass furniture, was covered with beautiful wreaths and crosses, sent by sorrowing friends, all testifying to the great esteem in which the deceased was held.
