OBITUARY

We regret to have to record the death of Mr. **W. GRAY**, which occurred at his residence, Lorne Cottage, Binstead, on Wednesday morning. The deceased, who was in his 60th year, had been in declining health for a long time and his death was not unexpected. He was the only son of the late Mr. W. H. GRAY, who in his day was a noted painter and sculptor, and who for some years lived in Ryde. The subject of this notice was also an artist, though for some years he has done little. His water colour drawings were much sought after, and his work was to be seen in all the chief exhibitions in the country. For some years he was the secretary of the I.W. Fine Art Society. He was a very clever chess player, and many years ago was a prominent member of the I.W. Thespians, an amateur dramatic society which was very successful. He was of a kindly and charitable disposition and was a govenor of the Royal I.W. County Hospital.
