she will as far as possible avoid any communication with my step brother Mr. John
S Hearn his conduct to me on several occasions not having been just or
honourable. In witness whereof I have to this my Will set my hand this twenty
seventh day of October one thousand eight hundred and fifty four – <i>Thos B Hearn</i> –
signed by the Testator Thomas Bayley Hearn as author of this last Will and
Testament in the presence of his wife at his request in his presence and in the
presence of each other have hereinto subscribed their names as witnesses – <i>Edmund</i>
Fairall – Henry Wilkes – his Clerks.
Proved at London 14th of September 1857 before the Judge by the oath of Anna Maria Hearn - Widow the Relict the sole Executor to whom was granted
having been first sworn by duty to administer.
