RETIRED POSTMAN'S BEREAVEMENT

Sympathy is felt with Mr. F. C. YELF, for many years, until he retired in 1950, one of the best known local postmen, in the death of his wife, Mrs. **Ethel Lily YELF** aged 61, which occurred at 4 West Hill Road on Saturday. She had been in failing health for a long period. A member of an old and respected Ventnor family, she was the elder daughter of the late Mr. Alfred COLEMAN, a longshoreman and yachting hand. During the first world war she was on the clerical staff at Ventnor Post Office and, subsequently, was receptionist at the Hotel Metropole, Ventnor. Her marriage took place in 1922, when her husband, who is the son of Mr. Fred YELF, a former member of Ventnor U.D.C., was a postman at Ventnor and a playing member of the local football club. He transferred to Ryde in 1936, since when they had made their home here. Mrs. YELF will be remembered by many friends here and at Ventnor for her kindness and unassuming disposition.

The Vicar (the Rev. A. J. PEARMAN), officiated at the funeral service at St. John's Church on Wednesday. The mourners were Mr. F. C. YELF (husband), Mr. and Mrs. V. T. TAYLOR and Mr. and Mrs. R. FRAMPTON (sons-in-law and daughters), Mr. and Mrs. COLEMAN (brother and sister-in-law), Mrs. F. GROVES (sister), Mr. J. GROVES (nephew), Miss YELF and Miss G. YELF (sisters-in-law also representing Mr. F. YELF, father-in-law), Mr. and Mrs. S. BARTON (cousins), and Miss SHAWYER. The interment took place at Ryde Cemetery and there were nearly 30 floral tributes. --- Mr. F. C. YELF and family express their sincere thanks to relatives and friends for their kind sympathy and lovely flowers, and to Dr. Helen SUTHERLAND and Nurse MASSEY for their devoted attention. They ask that this shall be accepted as the only acknowledgment.
