THE DEATH OF MRS. J. W. MITCHELL –

We regret to record the death of Mrs. **Emily Agnes MITCHELL**, wife of Mr. J. W. MITCHELL, senior diocesan lay reader in the Island. She had been an invalid for several months and passed away on Sunday at Lionstone House, The Strand, aged 78. A native of Devon she lived in Bath for over 50 years and on her husband's retirement came to live at Snowden, Granville-road, Cowes. For several years she was the Cowes representative of the I.W. Blind Society, and with her husband took an active interest in St. Mary's Church. On removing to Ryde she associated herself with St. James's Church where Mr. MITCHELL regularly assists in the services. She took a warm hearted and helpful interest in the church affairs and a few months ago with her husband received a handsome presentation from the congregation in recognition of their devoted service. A lady of kindly ways and charming disposition her death is much deplored. She leaves two sons and two daughters. The interment in the Cemetery on Thursday was preceded by a service at the house. The relatives and others present were Mr. J. W. MITCHELL (husband), Mr. L. W. MITCHELL (son), Miss MITCHELL (daughter), Mr. and Mrs. A. DIXON, Mr. and Mrs. R. BURKE, junior, Mrs. DODGE, Mrs. MAGSON, Miss DAWSON, Mrs. COOKE (Cowes), Miss CYRIL, Miss COOKE, and Miss NOWERS, Messrs. J. R. GRACE (churchwarden, St. James's) and O. SNOW. The Rev. E. E. M. GREEN took the service. There were 26 floral tributes including those from the council and congregation of St. James's Church and St. Mary's Church, Cowes. Mr. C. LANGDON was the undertaker.

NB: It has been noted that on all the official records searched, Mrs. MITCHELL's name was listed as Emily Agnes, rather than the other way round.
