DEATH OF MR. G. WALLIS.

A familiar local figure died on Friday week at 77 Park-road in the person of Mr. George WALLIS, who celebrated his 89th birthday early last month. He was the last surviving son of Ald. W. H. WALLIS, a former deputy mayor and well known local auctioneer. He was apprenticed to the late Mr. POLLARD'S pharmacy and subsequently conducted a business of his own at Eastleigh for 40 years, retiring nine years ago, when he returned to live with his sister in Ryde. He was a man of considerable intellectual attainment, well versed in scientific research, being a leading member of the Microscopical Society and making his own slides. He had been a member of the Hampshire Chess Club for a great many years. He was also a student of natural history and local antiquities and history. Although he was 80 when he returned to the Island, he was remarkably active. In the last four years he had walked to Newport and Bembridge. Until a week or so ago he regularly attended the Sunday services at All Saints' Church, where he was one of the oldest members of the congregation. Sincere sympathy is felt with his sister.

The funeral took place on Tuesday, the first part of the service being held at the Parish Church, conducted by the Rev. A. CORY (vicar). The committal was conducted at Ryde Cemetery by the Rev. J. OUTRAM. The mourners were Miss WALLIS (sister), Miss B. WALLIS (niece), Mr. and Mrs. Owen WALLIS (nephew and niece). Mr. H. W. BULSTRODE (nephew), Mr. and Mrs. A. J. BALLARD, Mrs. F. FILER, and Mrs. COTTON. The wreaths included a tribute from his tenants.
