Stanfell, R.N., of Courtfield, Ryde (one child--Hartopp Francis Charles Adderley, Captain 2nd Life Guards, born March 17, 1880); secondly, July 6, 1910, Julia Lucy, second daughter of the late General Sir Samuel Browne, V.C., GC.B., K.C.S.I., etc.; served in the Afghan War, 1879-1880 (mentioned in despatches, Brevet of Major); Lieut-Col. Royal Fusiliers, retired pay, 1887; Late Hon. Col. Commanding 5th Volunteer Battalion Hants Regt., 1894; J.P. for the counties of Hants, Hereford, and Sussex; and Deputy Lieutenant for I.W.; assumed by royal licence and warrant the name of Cradock in lieu of Adderley, 1886.
