### RETIRED YACHT-MASTER'S DEATH

The death took place on Tuesday at The Bungalow, Park-Road, of Capt. **W. R. BARNES**, a well-known retired yacht-master. The deceased, who was 77, had a long career at sea, covering a period of about 52 years. A native of Fishbourne, the late Capt. BARNES commenced his sea life as a lad in ships sailing from the port of London and had charge of the Jaqueline, Waterwitch, Peregrine, Kathleen and other yachts. He had a very wide experience, but had been living in retirement since the war. He was an old member of the Osborne Lodge of Freemasons and a Rechabite. Although he had been in ill health for many months Capt. BARNES kept about until the day of his death, the end coming quite suddenly. He leaves a wife, one son (Mr. Philip BARNES, who is the engineer of the Southampton and I.W. Steampacket Company's latest steamer, the Princess Elizabeth), and two daughters.

The funeral at Ryde yesterday (Friday) was attended by the widow and son and several friends. There were no flowers, by request.
