DEATH AND FUNERAL OF MRS. LIVINGSTONE

We regret to record the death of Mrs. **LIVINGSTONE**, of The Strand, which occurred at her residence on Friday of last week, after a short illness. The deceased lady was the widow of the late Jasper Hall LIVINGSTONE, Judge of the Supreme Court of the United States, and a large West Indian plantation owner. The funeral took place on Tuesday last, when the remains enclosed in an English oak coffin fitted with brass were conveyed to the Ryde Cemetery in an open hearse. The service in the Cemetery chapel was taken by the Rev. W.M. CAMERON, M.A., (Vicar of Holy Trinity), who also officiated at the graveside.

The chief mourners were Mr. Guy LIVINGSTONE and Major LIVINGSTONE, (sons), Mr. H.W. TINNE (son-in-law), Mrs. GOLDSMITH, Capt. BYNG, Mrs. and the Misses BYNG. The coffin bore the inscription "**Matilda Anne Cecilia LIVINGSTONE**, died 29th June 1906."
